General Hints and Tips for Writing an AP Psychology FRQ

Style & Organization

- → THINK before you start writing.
- → FORMAT
 - ◆ DO NOT write the essay in outline/bullet form
 - DO NOT write an introduction or conclusion
 - USE complete sentences
 - USE paragraphs to indicate answers to different parts of question
 - UNDERLINE the term in your answer so the reader can find it.
- \rightarrow Make sure you cover everything the question asks in the order it asks

Content Hints

- → K.I.S.S. IT! Keep It Simple Silly.
 - Do what you can to get your point across but DO NOT overcomplicate things. Be Clear. Do not ramble.
 - Most importantly ANSWER WHAT THE QUESTION IS ASKING
- → Identify Clarify Apply Explain
 - For each bullet or term, <u>identify</u> what it is through a definition, then <u>clarify</u> the definition with another sentence or sentence extension; next **apply**, **apply**, **apply** the term to the scenario given and **explain**, **explain**, **explain** their application.
- → GIVE examples from course, not personal life.
- → USE psychology terms. Readers are looking for your psychological knowledge.
- → WRITE SOMETHING. If you are clueless about a term, do not despair. Do your best and write something. You might hit on what the rubric asks for. If not, you will not be penalized for trying.
- → Most rubrics will follow an 6-8 point scale

Remember the Acronym SODAS!

<u>SPACE</u> - Space out your answer

ORDER - Keep the order of the prompt

DEFINE - Define everything

<u>APPLY</u> - Apply everything to the prompt

<u>SYNONYMS</u> - Use Synonyms in order to avoid parroting the prompt
